- Scientific search, e.g.

  - <http://citeseerx.ist.psu.edu/>
- Talk to your if you find papers that seem not available to you. He might be able to access them.

Your seminar paper should

- describe and compare the different papers you find/get
- point out what you think is good or bad about the approach and why you think so
- cite to prove what you write
  - This means mentioning the literature you use

Bachelor Students should write around 10 pages

Master Students around 15 pages

- Plagiarism
  - The supervisors know the papers you collected, so copy and paste stuff from them
  - If you find a similar paper copy sentences like „We propose in our method...“
  - If you cite, cite whole chapters
- Deadlines are for losers, delay everything as long as possible
